### MCA NATIONAL SHOW FOR 2008 UPDATES

We have decided to table the idea of hosting an MCA national show until we can determine how and if we can assemble the large amount of volunteers required to staff such a large, multi-day event. The earliest we anticipate applying is 2010.

### LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

HB2465 has passed in the House of Delegates as of February 6. Please continue to write to the Senate to get the bill to pass.

### MUSTANG NEWS

At the most recent Barrett-Jackson auto auction this past month, the only existing 1966 Shelby Super Snake Cobra sold for a record \$5.5 million. Only two were built. The other one was originally sold to Bill Cosby who promptly returned it, and the final owner drove the car in the Pacific. The first 2007 Shelby GT500 production car #001 sold for \$600,000. Many other Mustangs were sold at almost unbelievably high prices. Several celebrities such as Alice Cooper and Sammy Hagar were at the show to sell some of their personal vehicles. Re-runs of the auction can be seen on the Speed Channel.

The first GT-H car was sold last year for \$250,000. Hertz plans to sell the remaining cars when they reach 18K miles. Approximately 113 of the remaining 499 Shelby GT-H cars were sold through auctions open to Ford Dealers only. There are no figures officially available, but it is rumored that the first car sold for \$90,000 when the expected selling price was \$36,000. While

they may appear for sale at local dealerships, they will probably not last for long. Expect to pay premium prices.

Rumors of future Mustang updates include a styling upgrade for 2009 and a new V6 base engine that will produce 360-380 hp, while the GT engine is anticipated to receive a larger engine that will produce about 400 hp. The Mustang may be redesigned about 2012 and will reportedly be based off the Falcon chassis, which the Falcon is still a very common nameplate in Australia.

### FORD NEWS

Ford has announced that the Taurus and Sable names will return in 2008. The Five Hundred will be renamed the Taurus, and the Mercury Montego will become the Sable. An upgraded version of the Freestyle crossover will be available as the Taurus X. CEO Alan Mulally insisted on bringing back the Taurus nameplate since it was one of Ford's best known brands, and they must move forward on the strengths of their most common brands such as the Taurus, Mustang, and F-150.

Ford reported record losses of \$12 billion for 2006 and was forced to borrow \$20 billion in its restructuring efforts. Sales were down 8 percent over 2005 as smaller and more fuel efficient vehicles became more popular to consumers.

### TEN BIGGEST LIES FROM AUTO DEALERS

Although consumers are more price-savvy than ever thanks to the internet and other available auto pricing services such as those available through Consumer Reports, there are still some shady dealerships and salespersons out there. Watch out for the following:

1. Pricing incentives that "disappear" at the end of the month. While this may be true in some cases, the \$1500 cash back bonus available on Feb 28 should still be available on March 1.
2. Paying off the balance of a loan. Watch for hidden fees and payments if you are trading in a vehicle that is not paid in full.
3. Push for extended warranty. You have to read the fine print to make sure it covers everything you want, especially wear and tear as well as mechanical failure. There are other sources to purchase extended warranty coverage besides the dealer, such as AAA. You usually have up to 36 months/36K miles to purchase an extended warranty, before the manufacturer's bumper-to-bumper one expires.
4. Excessive charges for pre-delivery work. If you want upgraded wheels, expect some labor charges, but watch out for those \$100 and higher.
5. "Price Packing". In a sneaky way, extra money winds up in your monthly payment that may result in you paying hundreds of dollars over your negotiated sales price.
6. "We have the car in inventory". A buyer may be told the desired car is in stock and ready for delivery, when it may actually not be arriving for a couple of days. See the vehicle in person.
7. "No bank fees on all leases". This may only apply for specific models that are not selling as well and not all vehicles on the lot.
8. "Only 5 left at this price". Watch that this price does not include balloon payment financing, where a large payment is due at the end of a short period.
9. "100,000 is tough". There is nothing magical or bad about a trade-in vehicle with 100,000 miles or more. Don't let the dealership devalue the car more than the book value. Most likely

10. More on "in-stock" vehicles. You want a base model. The dealer doesn't have one, but has the upgraded models. While they can often get you a good or even great deal on the upgraded model that is on their lot, keep in mind you will probably be paying more than you originally planned
