MUSTANG AND FORD NEWS BRIEFS


- Hau Tai-Tang, most recently director of Ford SVT and instrumental in the development of the 2005 Mustang, has been promoted to director of product development for Ford's operations in Brazil.
- Ford reports strong sales in China for the first six months of 2007. The leading seller was the Focus at 93,000 units, a 66% increase over last year. However, US sales for June were down 8% over last year.
- Investors in Dubai are interested in buying Land Rover and Jaguar from Ford. Ford has discussed selling these non-profitable brands as part of its restructuring.
- Several Ford/Lincoln/Mercury products made a list of Forbes' "Top 10 Most Patriotic Vehicles" for vehicles assembled in the U.S. with mostly U.S. parts: Ford Freestyle, Lincoln MKX, Lincoln Mark LT truck, and Mercury Montego.
- Ford is already offering end-of-model-year incentives such as rebates and 0% financing. If you're looking for a new Mustang or other Ford vehicle, you may want to start shopping now.

What's New - Mustang For Men: The Essence Of Retrosexual by Estee' Lauder

Este'e Lauder and Ford Motor have joined forces to bring a new men's fragrance to the market, which will be simply called Mustang after the car. The new scent



is meant "...to appeal to 'retrosexuals' — a guy's guy, the opposite of a metrosexual. This isn't a car fragrance. It's a lifestyle brand."....Mustang will be mass-marketed starting in July of 2007 and initially distributed Sears, J.C. Penney and Kohl's Department Stores. A month later in August, one will be able to find it in Wal-Mart, CVS and Target, among other retail places. "The scent, developed by Trudi Loren, vice president of corporate fragrance development worldwide for the Este'e Lauder Cos. in cooperation with Firmenich, is characterized as a "rugged oriental." It has top notes of lavender, ginger and lemon; a heart of pipe tobacco and cedar wood, and a drydown of amber, fir balsam and patchouli. Cologne sprays in three sizes -1 oz. for \$20, 1.7 oz. for \$25 and 3.4 oz. for \$32 — will be sold, as will a 3.4- oz. aftershave. More ancillaries are planned for spring 2008."
