#### MUSTANG AND FORD NEWS BRIEFS

• Mustang sales continue to dip downward for May 2008. There was a 4% drop from April to May 2008. Compared to May 2007 when 17,748 vehicles were sold, in May 2008, there were only 9,633 vehicles sold; this is a 45% drop. Year to date 2008 Mustang sales are 44,160 compared to 64,560 through the equivalent period of 2007, representing a 32% drop.

• Ford finalized its sale of Land Rover and Jaguar to India's Tata Motors on June 2. The final sale price was \$2.3 billion (1.48 billion Euros). Ford will continue to supply Tata with engines, stampings, and technology.

• Ford's overall sales are down 16 percent in May 2008 compared to May 2007. Sales of SUV's and even the #1 F-150 pickup have slowed considerably due to high gas prices. A Michigan Ford truck plant will be idled for five weeks starting this month.

• Ford will cut its salaried workforce by 15% by August 1 as part of its restructuring.

• Ford will build the Fiesta subcompact near Mexico City. This is considered a blow to the UAW. Currently, no sub-compacts from any manufacturer sold in the U.S. are built here.

• The Ford Focus was listed as a recommended vehicle in a testing of smaller, fuel efficient cars in the July 2008 issue of Consumer Reports.

• Rocker Neil Young is attempting to retool his 1959 Lincoln Continental to an all-electric vehicle using a customizer named Jonathan Goodwin from Wichita, Kansas.

## 40TH CELEBRATION OF SHELBY GT500KR

Celebrating the fortieth anniversary of the 1968 Shelby Cobra GT500KR, Ford and Shelby Automobiles will unveil the 2008 Shelby GT500KR at the 2007 New York International Auto Show. Just like its 1968 namesake, the 2008 Ford Shelby GT500KR builds on the strong foundation of the Shelby GT500. Packing 40 more horses under its custom-designed carbon composite hood, the GT500KR is the most powerful production Ford Mustang ever produced.

"I'm proud to once again be a part of an historical moment, bringing back the 'King of the Road' Mustang, and collaborating with Ford SVT and Ford Racing," said Carroll Shelby. "I'm committed to continuously upping the ante when it comes to performance, and it's great to be doing it with Ford."

The 1968 Shelby Cobra GT500KR was a mid-year introduction, based on the 1968 Shelby GT500. Ford added 'Cobra' to the Shelby's moniker to help usher in the beginning of a new performance era at the company. The Cobra name referred to the new 428 Cobra Jet V-8 that was planted under the KR's custom fiberglass hood. It was the engine that would once again vault the Mustang to the head of the pack.

"The return of the Shelby GT500KR further establishes Mustang as the true king of the pony car segment," said Robert Parker, manager of Ford Car Brand. The Shelby GT500KR will be produced in an exclusive run of 1000 units and will begin arriving in Ford dealers in the spring of 2008.
