CELEBRATING LIVES WHILE HONORING A MEMORY

On August 26th, 2015, the community was shaken as two members of the WDBJ7 team lost their lives. As part of the WDBJ7 Mornin' Show, Alison Parker and Adam Ward became familiar with the Roanoke Valley Mustang Club through annual promotions of the annual car show. Upon hearing of this tragedy, the Roanoke Valley Mustang Club decided to give back to those who meant so much to us. The Alison and Adam Memorial Cruise In was hosted by the RVMC and WDBJ7 and was held on October 10th, 2015. To spite the chill in the air and the misting rain hitting windshields, approximately sixty cars came out for the event. As always, the community did not let the weather hinder their spirit of remembrance and giving. In addition to music, food and raffles that occurred, Bobby LaPrade, the RVMC President spoke to WDBJ7 regarding the event, "We wanted to do something for them since they did so much for us". In total, the cruise in raised just over \$7,000, which includes a substantial donation from Wells Fargo. The funds will be equally divided and donated to the Salem High School Educational Foundation in Adam Ward's name and the Patrick Henry Community College Scholarship Foundation in Alison Parker's name. Again, thank you to everyone who came out and helped in making the cruise in a success!

DID YOU KNOW???

The first Mustang, a convertible model with the VIN 5F08F100001, was intended to be used as a model to be sent on a tour of dealerships. But in Newfoundland, the vehicle was accidentally sold to a customer. That customer was an airline pilot who kept it and drove it for about 10,000 miles before trading it back to Ford for an equally auspicious numbered Mustang: Mustang number 1,000,001. Fortunately, Ford was able to preserve the first Mustang after the customer returned it, and the vehicle is on display at the Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan.

Then there is Gail Wise, an elementary school teacher who bought a Mustang to make her commute to the suburbs more fun. A salesman revealed it to her from under a tarp, and she bought it two days before the Mustang was introduced at the New York World's Fair. It was the first Mustang to be officially sold to the public -- and she has the dated bill of sale to prove it. Wise and her husband, Tom, still own the Mustang today, and it was fully restored in 2007.


